In keeping with our mission to report in-depth stories relevant and related to Muslim communities across the UK and Europe, the successful applicant will have a broad-ranging understanding of the role Muslims play in society, from Bradford to Berlin and beyond. In addition to a strong commitment to covering important social issues, you will also possess a keen interest in culture, the arts and technology.

Hyphen is a unique online destination, dedicated to serving an audience comprising European Muslims, thought leaders and individuals who wish to gain a deeper insight and understanding of the communities around them. Our catalogue of published pieces includes everything from longform features on the barriers to appropriate mental health care encountered by young British Muslims and the cultural significance of the German döner kebab to regular celebrity interviews. We have also broken exclusive stories on the neglect of asylum seekers, the deaths of British pilgrims during Hajj and the UK's critical lack of new social housing, which have won us attention in parliament and award nominations. As such, creativity, curiosity and enthusiasm are valued qualities.

The successful candidate will be supported by an experienced team of media professionals from a range of different backgrounds — including the editor in chief and deputy editors — to build the skills necessary for a future career in journalism. Over the course of the internship, you will perform research for Hyphen projects, write social media posts and report news stories. You will also conceive, pitch, develop and produce longer features. An interest in multimedia storytelling is advantageous.
